



Tēnā koutou e ngā whānau o te kura Greetings to all the families of the school I trust this finds you well as the term progresses.

Last week we enjoyed our focus on cultures within the school. The annual parade was a beautiful thing to behold as our children took pride in where they

come from. We noticed an increasing number of pupils being proud to claim their Māori heritage and 37 other flags where paraded alongside this. Our comment to our pupils reflects that, no matter where we are from we are made in our God's image, people of his workmanship, different and yet so much the same. Because we are made in His image we have reason and capacity to treat all as equals. Not only that but our Heavenly Father had a hand in designing the intent of the Treaty of Waitangi (te Tiriti o Waitangi) which is to honour those who were here first, protect their place as first people and, through agreement, welcome everyone else from around the world to be part of this beautiful place. The history of the Treaty and its origins in the UK make for interesting reading and really do highlight God's hand in forming our country. I wonder if sometimes we lose sight of the blessed place that we are in as we focus on what is wrong and miss so much of what is right? God is good!

On quite a different topic, it is surprising how quickly the end of this term will arrive. I heard a discussion on the radio yesterday about when people begin to put up Christmas decorations. It is too early for such things in my mind but there are a number of things for you to be aware of as we begin to close out the year:

Class Placements for 2021 - We have begun the work of placing our pupils into classes for 2021. These decisions take time and every child is considered individually and as part of the bigger picture. There is nothing random about the class placements as we work within the resourcing we have. As you ponder this please be aware that we have done quite a shift of teaching staff throughout the school for 2021. You will find that teachers that you thought would be in the learning community your child is moving into are quite likely to not be at that level. Rest assured we are very deliberate about the teaching teams every year

and the strength and professional capacity of our staff mean that every level will be served with excellent teaching and learning — on this I am totally confident. I will outline more of this much later in the year.

Reports - End of year reports will be coming home for all pupils and will be put in envelopes and given to your child on Friday 4 December if all goes according to plan. These reports will summarise the years learning and achievement for each of our pupils in what has been a very different year to the one we expected on day one in February. We will let you know via the school app when to look out for these.

Prizegiving - I hope you have this in your diary for Friday night 11 December at the Lincoln Events Centre. All pupils must attend and be there no later than 5pm. As always, we aim to finish by about 7.45 and this is the last thing that happens in the year. The school is closed for the summer holiday from Monday 14 December.

Building Developments - Over the coming months two projects will get under way. We are replacing the grass area in the primary space with permanent turf thanks to the outstanding efforts of the Parent Association working in partnership with our Proprietors. This will make a significant difference, especially in the winter months as we will be able to use this space even when everywhere else is very wet. We hope to have this complete for the start of 2021.

The second project is the renovation of Ti Kouka block into the main school entry, administration space and staff room. Hopefully this will happen in two stages and be fully complete by the end of 2021. We look forward to a big difference in how we are able to welcome our community into the school. The current admin and staff area will become our Counselling, Learning Support and English Language area.

Finally, thank you for your ongoing prayer and support of the schools functions as we work to serve you and your family.




