

#### Kia ora Aidanfield Whānau

What a great start to the year. The informal feedback I have heard regarding the start of year interviews is that many found these a positive way to start the year, notwithstanding the juggle parents needed to do around timings. Our young ones found it helpful to meet teachers they might not know before they started in a full classroom. I also enjoyed seeing so many families join our start of year picnic last week. Large communities are supported by individual connections as families link with families and with various aspects of the school. Thank you to all of you who took time to do so through the range of opportunities these last few weeks.



One of our school strategic goals is to develop a culture of manaakitanga (or hospitality, kindness, generosity and support). In doing this we want to enhance opportunities for all age levels to lead and serve both individuals and the wider community. In this sense we are encouraging the fruits of the Spirit talked about in Galatians 5, which are expressions of a freedom in our Lord to love others as we love ourselves. An aspect of this loving others is to welcome those who are new, generously.

On the first day with all our students we had our first mihi whakatau of the year. A mihi whakatau is a warm and inviting way to meaningfully acknowledge and welcome those who are new to our community. It is a format we have borrowed from Māori culture and is supported by our local marae, Ngāti Moki. Our mihi whakatau is an expression of Biblical truth and a practical outworking of the love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control we are called to express as part of who we are. We welcomed over 60 new people to our school from new entrants to year 10, new staff and international visitors. In this setting it is powerful to look to our God who calls us together from all parts of the world and to remember His love for us and our call to love others. And now we are underway.

#### **Enrolment Scheme change**

The Ministry of Education has now confirmed our new enrolment scheme. The Ministry must follow the law and is responsible for all enrolment schemes at all schools. Our community had a chance to feedback directly to the MOE in 2024. There are some significant changes to our new enrolment scheme. A couple of notable changes include:

- **If you move out of the ACS school zone** and then apply for a child to enter the school, even if you have a child at ACS already, you will be an 'out of zone' applicant. This is a big deal if you plan to shift houses.
- **Our zone boundaries have shifted.** We have lost Lincoln and Rolleston and parts of Hornby. These areas are now 'out of zone' for ACS. However, if you live in one of the old zoned areas you will be treated as 'in zone' until you remove your child or children from the school. After that you will become an 'out of zone' enrolment.
- There are new categories in the priority order that the school must follow to determine who is offered a place and who is not.

We operate the enrolment scheme with as much transparency and integrity as possible. Over the last few years we have received up to 300 applications per year. The new enrolment scheme will possibly help with this. Our confirmation of growing to a larger roll over the next five years with a maximum 550 students in 2030 will also help with this pressure. In 2025 and 2026 our maximum roll is 450 students. We are planning building classrooms in 2027 to accommodate the larger roll.

#### The ACS car park experience - making sense of the space

I spent time at the picnic talking about how to use the car park. Please pay careful attention the map in this newsletter. Our families with younger children should have priority access to our kiss and drop and carpark zone. To help with this, there are some key things to consider:

- Middle school students could meet their pickup car somewhere down the street after a short walk. Nga Puna Wai carpark is available, the side streets around the school could work. Please consider this option to reduce the traffic in the carparks. Walking is a healthy activity I am told.
- Arrive later. Perhaps older students could expect their pickup between 3.10 and 3.20. This would spread the number of cars at any
  one point out and make it quicker for everyone.
- Avoid turning right from Nash Road to Aidanfield Drive this really does hold up the line a lot. Turn left and go around the
  roundabout to come back up the other way a couple of minutes difference makes a difference for so many.
- Could it be possible to scooter or walk to school?
- Remember the kiss and drop zone is for a 20 second stop it should be quick so make sure your child knows to look out for you and get to the car quickly.

Please - check the map and instructions in this newsletter carefully and help everyone have a better car park experience.

Don't forget - all passengers MUST BE SEAT BELTED INTO THEIR SEAT.

#### After school care

#### Attendance at school

You will be aware of the Government focus to raise attendance of all children. ACS is required to record the type of absence each time a child is away with a code to explain the absence. We are also required to send this data daily to the Ministry of Education through our student management system. Under the law, sickness or a major family issue are the only reasons a student is legally allowed to be away from school once enrolled. I understand our text messaging feels harsh. Please understand, that we are trying to be transparent and open with how we are required to report student absence. If your child is needing to be away from school, please email <a href="mailto:absence@aidanfield.school.nz">absence@aidanfield.school.nz</a> via our SchoolApp (which is very easy...speaking as a father who has used it for such things) to let us know your child's name, class and the reason for their being away.

#### Finally

2025 is a year for the Board to develop the next three year strategic plan, which takes effect from 2026. Through this year there will be a chance to give your feedback on both how you feel the school is going and ideas or dispositions you would like to see the school develop. We look forward to receiving your feedback as we plan into the future.

#### **REMINDER: MINISTRY OF EDUCATION**

Requirements regarding Vomiting and Diarrhoea

Children with vomiting and diarrhoea must stay away from school until there has been no vomiting or diarrhoea for 48 hours. No waiting in carpark areas unless parked in a parking space. Consider picking your child up between 3:10-3:15pm.

NEW LAYOUT - the blue space

- Waiting line right next to the grass area.
- Children MUST NOT enter a car in this line
- Stay in your car
- Rejoin the flow when you can see your child-pick up from the kiss and drop zone only.
- Ensure the traffic flow is not hindered by your vehicle.

This sealed carpark is NOT a drop off zone. It is for parking only. If you park here you MUST exit following the one way arrows from 8:45am to 9:10am and 2:50pm and 3:15pm.
